ORDER LIFTING PUBLIC NOTIFICATION

By Order 98-1-24, issued January 23, 1998, the Secretary of Transportation determined that Port-au-Prince International Airport (PAP) did not maintain and carry out effective security measures. This determination was based on Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) assessments which revealed that security measures used at that airport did not meet the standards established by the International Civil Aviation Organization. Consequently, the Secretary directed that the public notification measures in 49 U.S.C. 44907(d) (1)(A) and (B) be implemented immediately.

Based on a FAA assessment conducted at PAP during the period of January 18-21, 2000, I am satisfied that PAP now maintains and carries out effective security measures. Accordingly, I am removing the public notification requirements previously imposed.

ACCORDINGLY:

1. I revoke Order 98-1-24, issued January 23, 1998;
2. This order shall be effective immediately; and
3. Copies of this order shall be served on all certificated air carriers, the Ambassador of Haiti in Washington, D.C. and the U.S. Department of State.
