NOTICE OF ACTION TAKEN DISMISSING APPLICATIONS—VARIOUS DOCKETS

This serves as notice to the public of the actions described below, taken on the date shown above by the Department official indicated (no additional confirming order will be issued in these matters).

The carriers listed below have applied for various forms of authority or relief under Title 49 of the United States Code in order to perform the air transportation activities described. Each application has either been withdrawn by the applicant or otherwise become moot. Therefore, we find that these applications should be dismissed, under authority assigned by the Department in its Regulations, 14 CFR § 385.3 and 385.13.

Information available to the Department indicates that Swiss World has no plans to prosecute this application.
OST-97-2713	<u>Jetflight Limited</u> , filed July 14, 1997. Foreign air carrier permit to engage in charter foreign air transportation of persons and property between the Cayman Islands and the United States. Information available to the Department indicates that Jetflight has no plans to prosecute this application.
49996	<u>Imperial Airlines, Ltd.</u> , filed January 4, 1995. Exemption authority to engage in charter foreign air transportation of persons and property between the United Kingdom and the United States, and other charters in accordance with 14 CFR Part 212 of our rules. Information available to the Department indicates that Imperial Airlines has no plans to prosecute this application.
49995	<u>Imperial Airlines, Ltd.</u> , filed January 4, 1995. Foreign air carrier permit to engage in charter foreign air transportation of persons and property between the United Kingdom and the United States, and other charters in accordance with 14 CFR Part 212 of our rules. Information available to the Department indicates that Imperial Airlines has no plans to prosecute this application.
