2001-5-31	CONSENT ORDER	VACATION EXPRESS HOLDINGS, INC., VIOLATIONS OF 49 U.S.C. §41712 AND 14 CFR PART 399:	05/30/01

This consent order concerns advertisements by Vacation Express Holdings, Inc. (“Vacation Express”) that violate 49 U.S.C. § 41712, which prohibits unfair and deceptive practices, and the advertising requirements specified in Part 399 of the Department’s regulations (14 CFR Part 399). This order directs Vacation Express to cease and desist from future violations and to pay compromise civil penalties.

2001-5-32	CONSENT ORDER	US AIRWAYS, INC. VIOLATIONS OF 49 U.S.C. §41712 AND 14 CFR 399.84:	05/30/01

This consent order concerns the failure of US Airways to incorporate surcharges, applicable to fares in certain markets, into the base fare initially displayed through one fare search feature on its Internet website. The omission of these surcharges violated the full-price advertising requirements of section 399.84 of the Department’s rules (14 CFR 399.84) and, in addition, violated 49 U.S.C. § 41712, the statutory provision that is the basis for that consumer protection rule. This order directs US Airways to cease and desist from future similar violations and to pay a compromise civil penalty.

VIOLATIONS OF 14 CFR PART 257 AND 49 U.S.C. §41712:</p> <p>This Consent Order results from an investigation by the Department's Office of Aviation Enforcement and Proceedings of the code-share disclosure practices of Air New Zealand, Ltd. ("Air New Zealand"). This investigation was prompted by a recent advertisement by Swain Tours ("Swain"), an agent of Air New Zealand, that violated the Department's code-share disclosure rules (14 CFR Part 257).
