2002-3-23	UNDOCKETED	<p><b>SITE59.COM, INCORPORATED VIOLATIONS OF 49 U.S.C. §41712 AND 14 CFR 399.84:</b></p> <p>The Department approves this settlement and the provisions of this order as being in the public interest, and, finds that Site59.com, Inc. violated 14 CFR 399.84 by causing to be published advertisements that failed to state the entire price to be paid by the passenger to the carrier for certain air transportation. By engaging in the conduct and violations described Site59.com, Inc. also violated 49 U.S.C. §41712. The Department orders Site59.com, Inc., to cease and desist from future violations of 14 CFR 399.84 and 49 U.S.C. § 41712; and, assesses Site59.com, Inc. \$40,000 in compromise of civil penalties that might otherwise be assessed for the violations found.</p> <p><b>Served: March 25, 2002</b></p>	03/25/2002

VIOLATIONS OF 49 U.S.C. §41712 AND 14 CFR 399.84:</b></p> <p data-bbox="667 1073 1252 1780">The Department approves this settlement and the provisions of the order as being in the public interest, and finds that Travelocity.com, L.P., violated 14 CFR 399.84 by advertising fares on its Internet site which failed properly to include applicable fuel surcharges and government imposed taxes and fees. By engaging in the conduct described, Travelocity.com, L.P., engaged in an unfair and deceptive practice and an unfair method of competition in violation of 49 U.S.C. §41712. The Department orders Travelocity.com, L.P., to cease and desist from further similar violations of 14 CFR and 49 U.S.C. §41712 and assesses Travelocity.com.
