SECTION 41310: The Department grants the request of Northwest Airlines, Inc. for a waiver of the statutory deadline in order to defer through February 1, 2000, the period for taking action on its complaint in Docket OST-99-5011. All foreign carriers, except the United Kingdom, are invited to apply for exemption authority to serve additional U.S. points on an extrabilateral basis, where those additional points would be served only on flights also serving Alaska.
